NEW RULES IN CYBERSECURITY AND AI

On 12 September 2025 Edgars Čerkovskis, Director of the Circular Economy Master's Programme, participated in the Bite Latvija Conference "New Rules of the Game in Cybersecurity: The Era of Al."

The event gathered experts from Latvia and abroad to discuss cybersecurity challenges in the age of artificial intelligence. In his presentation, Čerkovskis emphasized the importance of trust and transparency in creating a safe AI environment for businesses.

The conference fostered dialogue among companies, experts, and the public on topics ranging from deepfake risks to Al collaboration in workplaces, highlighting how responsible technology use can strengthen organizational resilience and social trust.
